



Sea Trust Wales Summer Internship 2025 (July & August)

The internship period will be from 1st July 2025 to 31st August 2025. Please note that internship opportunities are extremely competitive. We receive a huge number of applications and are unlikely to be able to offer feedback to all applicants.

Applications close at 12pm on 1st April 2025. We aim to invite successful applicants to interview by 18th April 2025.

About Sea Trust

Sea Trust Wales is a marine conservation charity based in Pembrokeshire. Our mission is to encourage local people to take care of their marine wildlife by conducting scientific research, raising awareness of marine conservation issues, educating the public and contributing to the conservation of the marine environment.

Our objectives are to protect our marine environment through education and collecting important scientific data on many of Pembrokeshire's protected species. We work all year round monitoring marine life around the coast and in the Irish Sea, conducting regular marine mammal surveys. We introduce residents and visitors to local marine life via our catch-and-release aquarium and visitor centre. We also work with school groups and local organisations to educate people about the marine environment and how they can work to protect it.

Summer Internship

We have three places available for our 2025 Summer Internship. The internship is unpaid but offers valuable experience and training. We are a small team and all help across multiple departments. Tasks are varied and are split between several departments including:

- Marine mammal research
 - Land-based Harbour porpoise photo-ID & abundance surveys, occasional boat surveys available
 - Data entry, updates & analysis
 - Writing reports & posters
 - Updating sightings pages
- Other wildlife surveys, e.g., seabirds, otters.

 - Research into marine plastics
 - Collection & recycling of end of life fishing gear
- Aquarium & Visitor Centre
 - Aquarium maintenance & husbandry, feeding, health monitoring, tank maintenance, releasing and collecting new species
 - Guided tours & Seashore Safaris
- Education & Outreach
 - School visits
 - Shows & events
 - Produce educational material & activities
 - Marine Biology Club (10-17 year olds)
- Fundraising
 - An opportunity to gain experience in grant applications and project budgeting
- Marketing and communication
 - Newsletter writing
 - Social media - creating content
 - Talks and presentations
- General- Day to Day
 - Visitor centre duties
 - Interacting with the public
 - Daily cleaning

Local Area

We are based at the Ocean Lab in Goodwick, situated on Fishguard Harbour. Pembrokeshire is a great location to see all wildlife especially marine, with dolphins seen from the office regularly. It is a great place for outdoor activities e.g. coasteering, diving, nature walks etc.

We have several contacts for local accommodation, with rental costs to be paid directly to the landlord. Interns take responsibility for contacting landlords directly to arrange accommodation, and Sea Trust Wales will not act as an intermediary.
